



Comfort Checklist

Find the solutions to your home comfort concerns



Check off the comfort concerns or problems that apply to your current home, or that you want to avoid in your new home.

- Electricity/gas bills are too high.** We are concerned about saving money on energy costs but don't want to sacrifice comfort.
- Our house is too hot or too cool when we return home.** We adjust the temperature to save money while away, but return home to an uncomfortable house.
- Some rooms are too warm, others are too cold.** For example, the 2nd floor, a room above a garage or a bedroom is too cold in winter, or too hot in summer.
- Noisy.** The existing system is noisy.
- The outdoor unit is accessible to children or pets.**
- Family member(s) troubled by allergies, asthma, or undergoing/recovering from cancer treatment.** Dust, pollen, mold and pet dander aggravate allergies. Billions of particles, many too small to be seen, are in the air you breathe every day, from bacteria and viruses to cooking and smoke particles.
- Stuffy air.** Exhaust fans in bathrooms and kitchens just aren't enough to keep the air fresh. The accumulation of gaseous pollutants from household products and building materials is also a concern.
- Muggy or Dry air.** Your home gets too muggy or too dry certain times of the year.
- Excessively dry air causes dry skin and nasal passages, and static electric shocks.** Overly dry air can also aggravate respiratory ailments and cause woodwork to shrink and crack and furniture joints to loosen.
- Moisture is damaging windows and woodwork.** As people upgrade windows, add siding or insulation, or replace an older furnace to save energy, excess humidity from cooking, laundry, and bathing becomes trapped inside.
